Fermanagh is rich in early Christian relics, the round towers and high crosses of Devenish Island continuing the earlier tradition of carved heads on Boa Island. Stone figures on Boa Island Viking raiders penetrated Lough Erne in the ninth century and are reported to attacked monasteries on and along the lake, including Devenish, in 837, and returning at times over the next century or so.
