Long II-V Jazz Guitar Licks (in two bars) The long II-V is a progression with chords that last two bars each and is also part of the bebop movement. Jazzers have harmonized standard tunes with lots and lots of those "long II-V's".

The ii-V-I is one of the most common chord progressions found in jazz standards and many other kinds of music, so it's important to have a rich vocabulary of ideas to play. You can learn licks by ear from jazz musicians you admire, and I highly suggest that. But I know that sometimes it can be overwhelming and you just need a place to start.

Moving into a minor II V I lick, here's a phrase that uses the A minor pentatonic scale to outline the iim7b5 chord. The A7alt chord features typical altered 9 th intervals that then resolve down to the Dm7 chord. This phrase over A7alt is a very traditional bebop line that you can take out of this lick and add to other areas of your jazz soloing.
