## **Classroom Applications of Constructivism**

Constructivism in the classroom generally emphasizes active student participation in the learning process through experiment, problem solving and



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discussion. The teacher works to understand the students' current state of knowledge and belief, then acts as a guide, ensuring that students address the essential issues and achieve reasonable intellectual outcomes.

## **Social Constructivism In The Classroom**

In social constructivist classrooms

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collaborative learning is a process of peer interaction that is mediated and structured by the teacher. Discussion can be promoted by the presentation of specific concepts, problems or scenarios, and is guided by means of effectively directed questions, the introduction and clarification of concepts and information, and

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references to  
previously learned  
material.
